



## General Meeting Notes

**Tuesday May 6, 2025 at 11:00AM at Riverside United Church**

- 1) President Joan Kinnie welcomed all especially new members.
- 2) Joan handed over the meeting to Lynda Heffernan and Anna Van Adrichem Rochon to talk about the Kern County, California inbound journey (May 13-20). Anna and Lynda went through the activities for the different days.<sup>1</sup> The Friendship Dinner hosts were also announced and which ambassadors they are hosting. The meeting was then broken up into small groups to finalize the arrangements.

These were 2 inbounds and an outbound to Leeuwen, Belgium likely to take place in April, 2026. Julie asked FFI to place FF Ottawa on a waiting list for an additional outbound, and shortly after, we were tentatively assigned an outbound to Perth, Australia (FFO has welcomed members of this Australian club in the past). The 2 inbounds are from Western Colorado (in May 2026), and from Western North Carolina (in September 2026) led by Nancy Wood who many of us already know from previous journeys.  
Thanks were extended to everyone who is helping with journey hosting. Anyone interested in a journey or being a coordinator can speak to Julie.  
FFI has added US\$15 per journey in addition to US\$25 per night.  
The board is seeking volunteers to review journey planning including a review of journey cancellations.

- 11) The next General Meeting will be in September, 2025 - date to be determined.
